



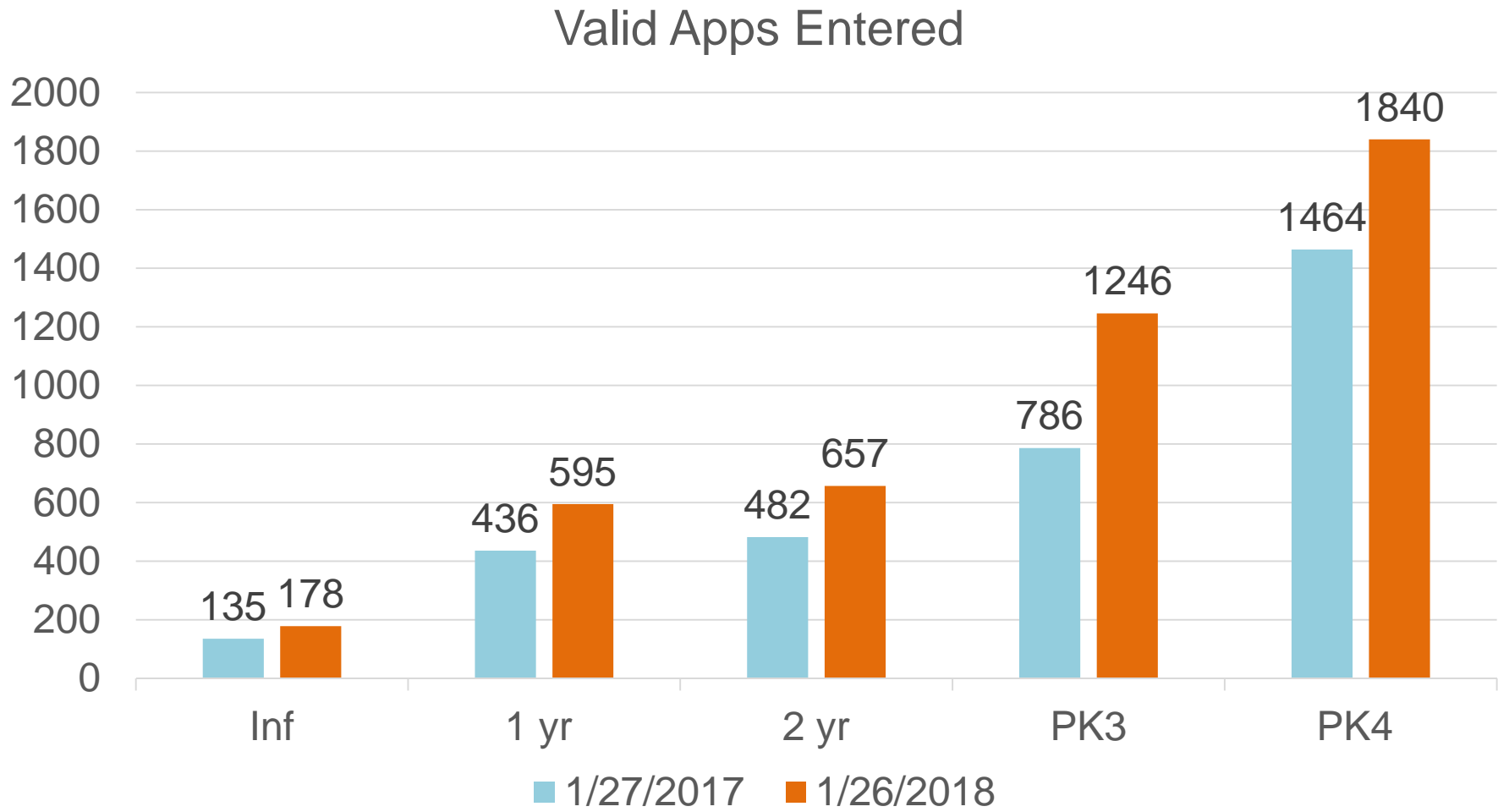

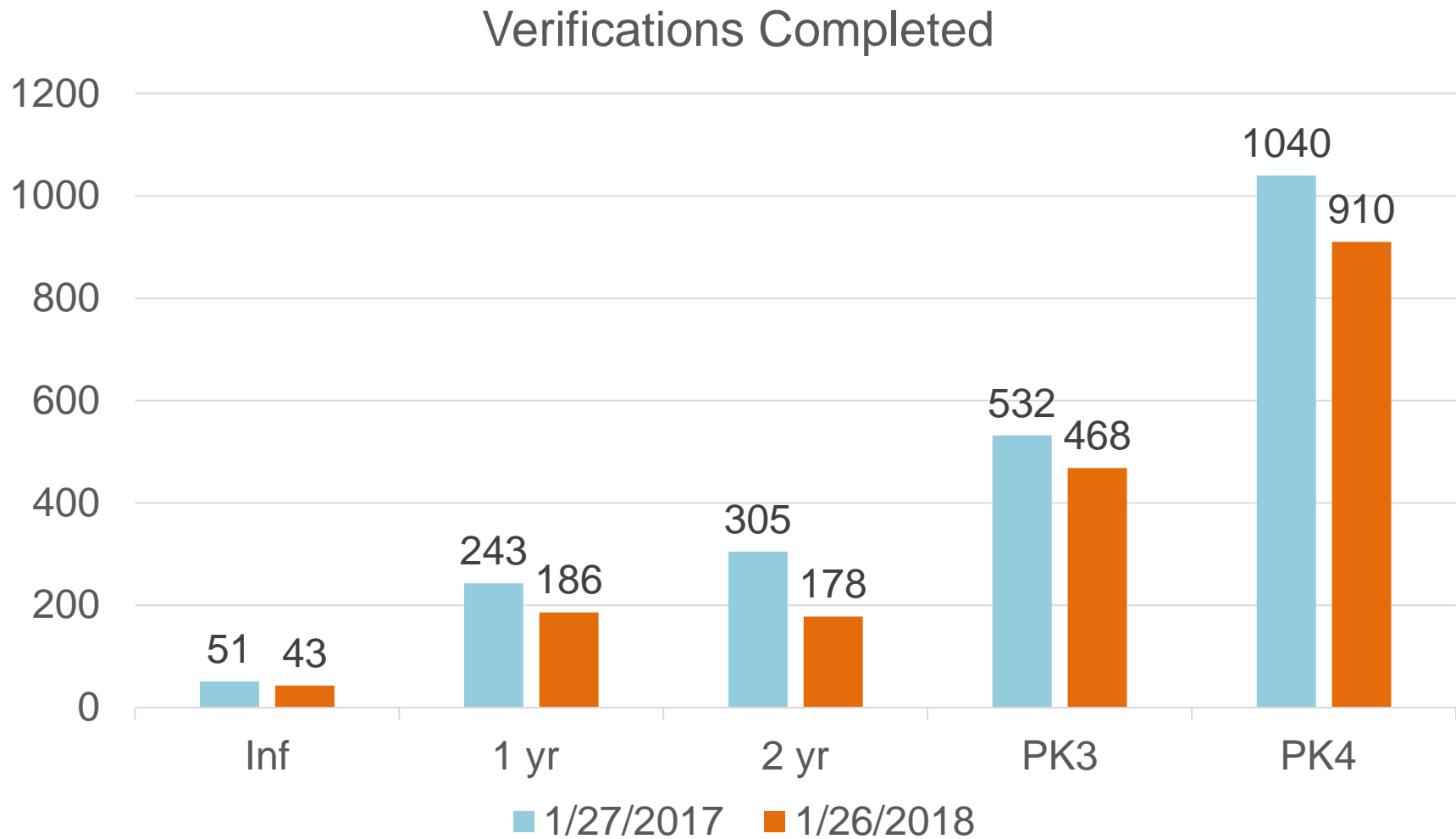
Comparison of Main Round Apps

Match Targets

What is the Match Target?

- The Match Target is one total number for each grade served that includes both returning and new students. It is necessary to include both returning and new students in the total for each grade because a given program may not know that a student has completed an application to transfer to a different program. If EnrollNOLA only sought to fill seats for “new” children a program would need to be sure who had completed an application and who had not. By giving EnrollNOLA the total number of seats by grade, programs can be assured that the match process will fill all possible seats.
- For Head Starts and EHS the match target is the same as the funded enrollment by grade.

Anticipate low numbers of eligible 4 year old applicants:

- We anticipate having more seats than eligible 4 year old applicants again for the 18/19 school year. We are asking Head Starts to prioritize serving 3 year old children and to set their match targets to only serve the rising 4 year olds in a given center.

Upcoming deadline:

- Match targets are due from all Head Start providers by Friday February 2, 2018.

Coordinated Enrollment Plan

Coordinated Enrollment Plan

- Annual plan due to LDOE 2/1/18
- Includes:
 - Policy Framework approved in November
 - Copies of all 2018-19 materials
 - All event details
 - Description of application, verification, matching, and registration process
 - Details on whether the network is meeting demand

How do we involve providers?

- In Fall 2017, we had 2 policy discussions to review what is working and what could be improved for the upcoming application cycle. Representatives from each funding source attended these meetings. Revisions were brought to the September NOEEN meeting and approved by NOEEN Steering Committee in November.

LDOE requests signatures from all Early Childhood providers demonstrating they have been engaged in the planning process and approve the plan.
